

Venue and accommodation



Sanxenxo is a village located on the north west of Spain. It is bathed by the Atlantic Ocean. Its privileged situation gives excellent weather as well as an environment with an incomparable charm in which highlights are beautiful beaches and natural landscapes of great beauty. Registration

Presentation

Authors willing to present their communications should submit an abstract (example below) and indicate their preference for oral or poster presentation. Oral presentations will be selected on the basis of quality and originality.

Deadline for abstract submission is March 18th. Abstracts will be accepted only if registration fees of the presenting author have been received. Authors will receive a confirmation via e-mail once registration has been completed. Authors selected for oral presentations must bring their PowerPoint presentations in portable USB devices.

Travel fellowships

Organizers consider important to stimulate the assistance of young scientist (PhD students or recent postdocs) to the conference, and offer 12 travel fellowships of $200 \in$. Applicants should send an email to secretaria.senc@kenes.com, detailing their motives for attending the conference. A short CV should be attached to this message, together with the abstract for communications. Deadline for fellowship application is March 15th.

No figures or tables are allowed. Word count for the text body should be 250 or less (including references, excluding title, authors' names and affiliations) Use Microsoft Word; Arial 12 pt


